

Level 2 **Dog Groomer**

A career in dog grooming is rewarding and fulfilling. For those with a passion for dogs, their unique personalities, and the wide range of different breeds, we can ensure participants gain the knowledge and technical skills to provide necessary care and conduct a range of grooms to a high standard. Individuals will be developing their knowledge and skills with a range of breeds within the industry but will be expected to establish their skills specifically working with wool, wool-mix, wire and the silk coat type.

A Dog Groomer will gain a detailed understanding of a range of subjects focused on maintaining the welfare of the dog throughout the grooming process, including:

Knowledge Development

- Requirements for preparing, bathing, drying and styling a range of coats
- Dog handling techniques and grooming processes relevant to the dog's needs
- Behavioural change indicators, including signs of relaxation, fear, and stress in dogs
- Canine first aid
- Dog anatomy and physiology including variations within breeds and coat types

Skills Enrichment

- Develop a dog grooming plan to meet the individual requirements of the dog and owner
- Handle and move dogs, adapting own behaviour to meet the needs of the dog
- Develop skills with bathing, drying and styling a range of breeds under the coat type
- Identify and escalate health and safety, and animal welfare concerns
- Communicate with colleagues, customers, and stakeholders using suitable terminology











Functional Skills

Maths and English qualifications are an integral element of the apprenticeship standards.

These are implemented by Haddon Training's dedicated Functional Skills team and will be delivered either as individual or group sessions, depending on the learner's requirements. If the learner has completed Functional Skills previously or can provide suitable evidence, such as GCSE certificates or similar, they may be exempt from completing this element of the qualification.

Qualification Overview

To achieve the Level 2 Dog Groomer qualification, learners must complete:

- All mandatory modules.
- All core behaviours.
- The End Point Assessment, in which all components must be passed.

The apprenticeship is awarded through the successful completion of an End Point Assessment (EPA). This consists of:

- A multiple-choice exam.
- A practical assessment in which the learner will be observed in a grooming consultation with a customer and conducting a full groom on one of the four coat types.
- A professional discussion in which the learner is questioned on the knowledge learnt throughout the apprenticeship.
- An interview with an external assessor on the learner's portfolio.

The qualification will take a minimum of 12 months to complete, dependent on a learner's prior knowledge and skills recorded on a skill scan and individual learning plan.
